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Developmental Play-Based Screening

WHAT should I expect at Play-based Screening?

- Your child will join a small group of preschool age children and engage in play and other developmentally appropriate activities
- The screening process will assess your child's speech and language skills, social skills, fine and gross motor skills, and play skills.
- Expect screening to last between 60-90 minutes

WHO will work with my child?

- An early childhood educator will be facilitating small group interactions and play.
- A school psychologist will observe play and social skills.
- A speech-language pathologist will observe language skills and speech intelligibility.
- A family liaison will interview the parents during the screening to discuss child's strengths and challenges.
- A nurse will conduct a vision and hearing screening.

HOW will I know the results of the screening?

- The results will be shared during an exit interview.
- Based upon the checklists completed during play-based screening observations, parent interview, and parent questionnaires, the following recommendations could be made:
 - No concerns at this time, no follow-up warranted
 - Mild concerns noted, rescreen at a later date
 - Referral for further evaluation
 - Based on information gathered through the screening referral form and interview, consideration for the Preschool For All Grant Program may be discussed.
