PLTW On-Site Training for Teachers

As part of the District's ongoing Professional Development commitment, elementary teachers took part in a two-day Project Lead the Way Launch Lead Teacher Training on July 29 and 30.

PLTW trainers facilitated the on-site training experience at Corron Elementary, providing supplies and innovative lesson plans for teachers to attain the necessary credentials to be able to teach PLTW lessons in their buildings.



"The training provides teachers an opportunity to view the curriculum from a different perspective, taking the role of learners and seeing the lessons as students," expressed Melissa Byrne, Director of College and Career Readiness.

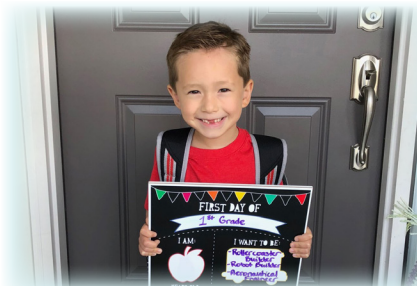

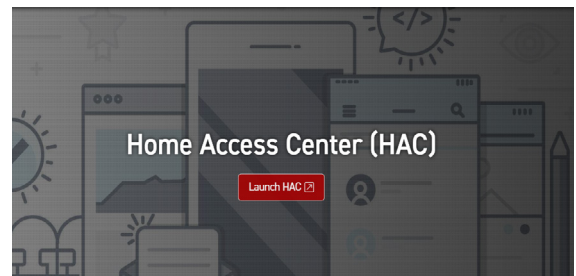

District 303 invites the entire community to an open house at the newly remodeled Thompson Middle School. The renovation project, which began in the summer of 2017, added air conditioning, 31 new classrooms, 11 new science labs, a new auxiliary gym, an expanded cafeteria, and a new track and field area. In addition, the newly constructed bus drop off and pick-up area behind the school will improve traffic flow on Indiana and 7th Streets.

After a short ceremony at 5:30 p.m., eighth grade students from the Where Everybody Belongs (WEB) program will conduct tours of the new facility. Student performances will be held throughout the building, and historical artifacts dating back to Thompson High School will be on display.



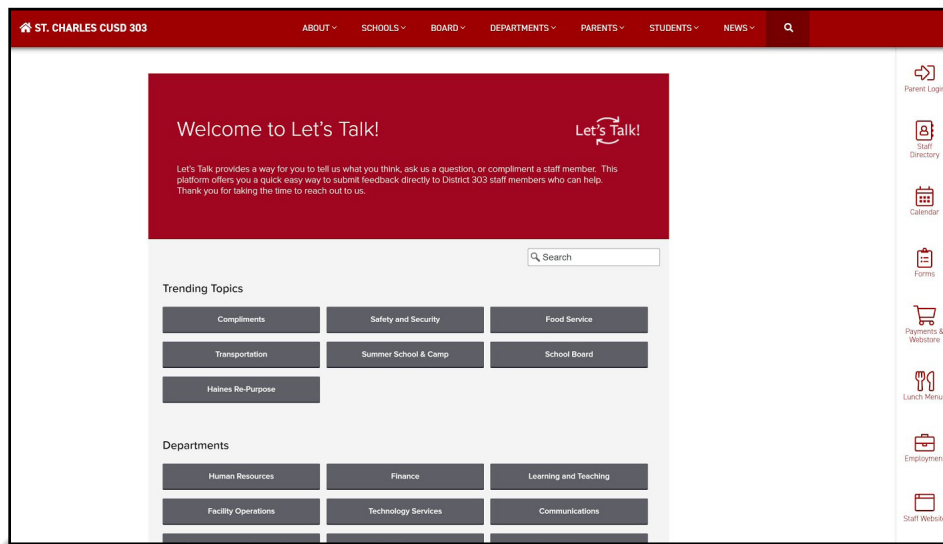
District 303 Welcomes you to Let's Talk!®

School Improvement Day on August 30

In January, the School Board approved the calendar for the 2019–2020 school year. Each year, there are days set aside that are used to provide our teachers with professional learning time. This year, our calendar includes both full day and half day institutes. We want to remind parents that the first half day institute takes place on **August 30**. While the arrival times are the same, students will be dismissed on the following half day schedule:

- **High School:** 7:20am–10:45am
- **Middle School:** 8:30am–12:10pm
- **Elementary School:** 8:40am–11:40am
- **Richmond:** 8:00am–11:40am

Bus Route Information

On Wednesday, August 14, schools in St. Charles Community Unit School District 303 will welcome over 12,000 students back for their first day of class. While it is an exciting time of the year for students, parents, and staff members, it is also a time when the volume of traffic on roads in and around St. Charles increases. For that reason, we are asking for your assistance in keeping all students safe while they travel between home and school.

The District 303 Transportation Department takes pride in its record of safety and service. Due to ongoing construction on roads within our district, we recommend that you encourage your child to ride the school bus, if that is an option. This will assist with traffic flow around the schools and ensure that students are dropped off in a secure location. Please only drive your student to school if it is absolutely necessary.

We ask that you remember the following items that will help keep our students safe during the school year:

- When you drive in the neighborhoods near schools while students are in session, please observe the posted speed limit signs - 25 mph in residential areas, and 20 mph in school zones.
- Please don't cut through neighborhoods as part of your route to or from our schools.
- Cell phone use is prohibited in school zones.
- Passing a school bus that is stopped and has its stop sign extended is a violation of the law, which can result in license suspension.



During the first week of school, additional student loading time is necessary to ensure that all students are safely on their buses after school. Because of the late departure times, bus routes may run 10-20 minutes late in the afternoon.

The bus routes developed by our Transportation Department during the summer are designed to maximize safety, and work as efficiently as possible. During the first two weeks of school, our drivers and transportation department administrators will gather information about the efficiency and timeliness of routes. After that time, any necessary changes will be made and parents will be informed. **We ask that you do not contact the transportation department during those two weeks.**

Elementary and middle school bus route schedules will be available on e-link at **noon on Wednesday, August 7**. High school bus route information will be available at **noon on August 12**. We encourage parents to check schedules again prior to the beginning of school to see if times have been updated.

BUS DRIVERS NEEDED!

Community Unit School District 303 is currently recruiting bus drivers to fill 11 open positions for the 2019-2020 school year. Many of the open positions are due to a large number of retirements that occurred at the end of this school year.

Starting pay for the part-time positions that are 4-5 hours per day is \$19.36 per hour. Drivers are responsible for a variety of routes including student pick-up in the mornings and drop off in the afternoons. Special routes for field trips, extra-curricular activities and the Fox Valley Career Center are also scheduled through District 303 transportation.

The District will train qualified candidates who want to obtain their Commercial Driver's License. The process takes about 6 weeks so those interested should apply in the next few weeks to give them time to be trained prior to the beginning of the school year.
