PARKING INFORMATION

Students who wish to park at St. Charles East High School must be a Junior or Senior only and must have a parking pass issued to them by the Dean's Office. The following will explain how to get a parking pass.

For students who already turned in an application:

- Parking passes /hang tags will be delivered to one of their classes next week (October 20-23)
- Students will be able to park in one of 2 student lots between yellow lines. Students can park either behind the Main Gym or by the Music Wing (do NOT park in the Range*). Yellow lines will designate student parking spaces.
- There is currently no charge for student parking for the 1st Semester. Any change in fees (2nd Semester) will be communicated in advance and the charge will be added to the student's Push Coin account.

For students who have not turned in an application:

- Students may turn in an application at any time, however, parking may not be guaranteed. This will be based on availability and demand on the given day (A or B).
- If students need a parking application, they can pick one up in the Dean's Office and return the completed application at their convenience.
- When a hang tag is given to the student, students will be told exactly where they are eligible to park.
- There is currently no charge for student parking for the 1st Semester. Any change in fees (2nd Semester) will be communicated in advance and the charge will be added to the student's Push Coin account.



What is Scholastic Bowl?

Scholastic Bowl is a game in which two teams compete head-to-head to answer questions from all areas of knowledge, including history, literature, science, fine arts, current events, popular culture, sports, and more. The defining feature of Scholastic Bowl is the use of a “buzzer system” that lets players interrupt the reading of a question when they know the answer. That element adds a dimension of confidence, anticipation, and rapid recall to a game about knowing facts. Answering with speed leads to opportunity for more points!





HOW TO WEAR A FACE MASK

Proper face mask usage is important to prevent the spread of illness. This includes proper techniques for wearing the mask, taking it on and off, and storing it.

HOW TO PROPERLY PUT YOUR MASK ON

1



Wash your hands with soap and water or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer before touching the mask.

2



If your mask has ear loops, use the ear loops to secure behind your ears.

3



If your mask has ties, bring the mask to nose level and tie the top straps across the upper part of your head, above the ears. Bring the mask over your mouth and under your chin. Once it is secure, tie the lower straps behind your neck.

4



Mold or pinch the area around your nose so the mask fits securely. Make sure it covers both your nose and chin.

Helpful Tips



- Do not touch the front of the mask.
- Do not forget to cover your chin.
- Do wear it securely over your nose, from the bridge of your nose to below your chin.
- Do make sure it is fastened securely and fits snugly on both sides, with no gaps.

HOW TO REMOVE A FACE MASK

1



Wash your hands thoroughly with soap and water or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.

2



Do not touch the front of the mask.

3



Use the ear loops to remove the mask. If your mask has ties, untie the bottom string first, then the top, and use the ties to pull the mask away from your face.

4



Properly dispose of your mask if necessary, or store it safely. Clean your hands.

Helpful Tips



- Wash and dry cloth masks daily.
- Store masks in a clean, dry location, like a paper bag. They should be carefully folded so that the outer surface faces inward.
- Make sure to clean hands before and after handling your mask.
- If you use a disposable mask, be sure to dispose of it properly.
