Munhall Elementary School Healthy School Snack Guidelines

Munhall Elementary is implementing guidelines for a healthy snack at all grade levels, Kindergarten through 5th in the 2018-19 School Year.

Why a healthy snack?

Childhood obesity has become a nationwide concern. Research proves children do better in school when they have at least 9-10 hours of sleep, a balanced diet, including 2 nutritional snacks daily, and exercise. As educators, we want what is best for students, so we are implementing guidelines for a healthy snack during the day. The Center for Science in the Public Interest recommends snacks in school be fruit and vegetables, since most children do not eat the recommended number of servings of fruit and vegetables.

Guidelines:

- The only snacks allowed in the classrooms include a fruit or a vegetable.
- All snacks will be working snacks lasting no more than 15 mins.
- Snack will be worked into the classroom schedule by a teacher.
- Any foods other than fruits or vegetables will **not** be allowed. These items will be returned home if brought in.
- The only beverage allowed with snack is water.
- No food will be stored in the classroom and all uneaten opened snacks will be disposed of. Unopened snacks will be sent home.
- Bringing a daily snack of individual portion is the responsibility of the child, no snack will be provided by the school.
- Sharing of all food is not permitted.

Listed below are some healthy choices to help guide you when deciding on your child's snack. Acceptable snacks include but may not be limited to:

- Any fruit or vegetable, washed and cut if necessary
- Raisins, dried fruit
- Frozen grapes or other frozen fruit
- Apple sauce
- Pickles
- Fruit cups or canned fruit
- Cut up peppers, edamame
- Fruit salad

Thank you for your cooperation in adhering to these guidelines as we strive to become a healthier school and bring good nutrition to the forefront.

Munhall Elementary will be implementing a no food during classroom celebrations and classroom reward policy. There will also be no food used during teaching time without the written consent of the principal.

Classroom parties must be celebrated at school without food. Alternative non-food classroom celebrations are allowable.

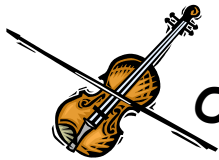

Dear Parents,

Welcome to all future string students! We are excited that you are considering enrolling your child in the orchestra program! Students can begin a string instrument in 3rd, 4th or 5th grade. With your encouragement and support, playing music will become a natural part of your child's life. There are many benefits to being involved in orchestra. Besides learning new musical skills, students develop creativity, discipline and responsibility. They will learn to work as a team and enhance their ability to use critical thinking skills.

The decision to play an instrument is not a small one. It will require time, patience, and a commitment to practice; however, it will be a very rewarding experience. Participation in music will give them something to be proud of and hopefully be involved in for a lifetime.

Following is an overview of the String program and a list of the forms you'll need to enroll your child.

- **Orchestra Enrollment . Registration is available online. Please see the form for instructions.**
- **August Beginner Strings Class Flyer and Registration Information.**
- **Orchestra Program Guide.** This is a description of the orchestra program.

Please note: Due to the new transitions of students and schools, the location and day of the week for early morning rehearsals for beginning string students is still to be determined. Before School Rehearsals will begin in late September and run through the through the end of April. These rehearsals are from 7:30-8:30 am once a week.

- **Obtaining a Quality String Instrument for Orchestra**

As long as you rent from one of the listed vendors, you will get a quality instrument. With any company, be sure to get the insurance/maintenance plan. The Vendor Fact Sheet (back side) provides a comparison and a brief overview of each of the rental companies, with price, etc.

Rental / Purchase It is strongly recommended that you rent an instrument rather than purchase one. As your child grows, they will change instrument sizes several times. String instruments can also be very expensive to repair. Renting an instrument allows you the flexibility of changing to new instrument sizes as needed and includes an instrument/maintenance plan to cover the cost of repairs.

Instrument Size: You will need to know what Instrument size your child needs before ordering. Sizing of instruments will take place as soon as possible before the end of school, so you can provide that information to the rental company.

Please contact us if you need assistance with the rental process or have a question about the orchestra program. We are looking forward to seeing your child in orchestra having fun, and making great music very soon.

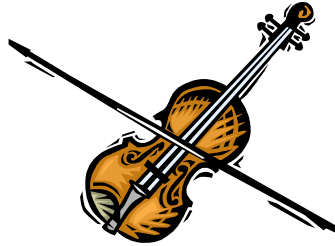

A GUIDE FOR PARENTS

Welcome to the St. Charles Elementary Orchestra Program! The study of music is much more than simply learning to play an instrument. Music benefits young people in many areas of their lives. Communication and social skills are strengthened and creative and analytical skills are nurtured. Learning to play an instrument and participating in an ensemble are valuable experiences for all students. District 303 orchestra directors are committed to providing students with meaningful learning opportunities and positive musical experiences. We look forward to sharing our love and enthusiasm of music with your child!

AUGUST 2018 BEGINNER STRINGS CLASS.

A Beginner Strings Class is held August 13 - 17. This camp is highly recommended since students will get a head start on playing skills and daily instruction to reinforce proper instrument playing position. For more details, see the *"Beginner Strings Class"* flyer.

SMALL GROUP LESSONS

Instruction consists of a 30 minute lesson each week during the school day. Students are placed in small groups according to instrument and participation in the Summer Beginner Class. Lessons give directors time to work more closely with each student to improve fundamentals such as note reading, tone, rhythm, basic music theory, instrument technique, and reading music.

LARGE GROUP REHEARSALS

Students in orchestra participate in weekly ensemble rehearsals which take place once a week before school. These rehearsals are an important and required part of the D303 Elementary Strings Program. If students are attending school that day, they should be at the rehearsal too. Starting dates will be given in the fall and usually run from the first week in October through the end of April. If the rehearsal is not at your child's school, a bus will take them to their home school in time for the start of the school day.

CONCERTS

There are two required concerts a year. Other performances may include Fiddle Fest, recitals, etc.

ATTENDANCE & COMMITMENT

Participation in Orchestra requires good attendance and a strong commitment to personal improvement and group contribution. Because rehearsals and performances cannot be made up, students are required to attend all orchestra lessons, group rehearsals, and performances (except for illness or family emergencies). Excessive absences may result in the loss of participation. If the student is well enough to attend school, he/she is expected to attend orchestra. Group rehearsals and lessons will take place each day that school is in session. Changes in the schedule will be announced in advance.

PRACTICING

A consistent practice routine is an essential aspect of playing a musical instrument. Parental involvement through listening to your child's practice can make a big difference in their success. It is recommended to practice for 10-15 minutes at first, at least 5 days a week. Establishing a consistent routine is very important in order to make steady progress!

INSTRUMENT

Students need an instrument in good playing condition with proper set up. **Renting** an instrument rather than **purchasing** one is recommended for string instruments for several key reasons. They require maintenance and regular service, and students will go through several sizes as they grow. Most students begin playing on a 1/4, 1/2 or 3/4 size instrument, and take a few years before they are ready for a full size. Please see "Obtaining a String Instrument" for more information.

OTHER MATERIALS NEEDED:

- The method book *Essential Elements 2000*
- A music stand for home practice (available through the string rental company you choose.)
- A sturdy one inch 3 ring binder for lesson materials and handouts.

OBTAINING A QUALITY STRING INSTRUMENT

Dear Parents,

As a parent investing in your child's music education, it is very important to invest in a quality musical instrument. So called "bargain" instruments, available online or at discount stores may seem tempting; however, experience has proven over and over again that these instruments are truly no "bargain" at all. Most often, the low price is the result of poor workmanship and lower quality materials. These instruments usually break more easily and are difficult, sometimes impossible, to repair. In many cases, they do not stay in tune and the quality of the sound they produce is very poor. It is disheartening to see a child's enthusiasm for music diminished by an instrument that does not allow them to reach their full potential.

Please Note: You are not obligated to rent from our recommended vendors; however, instruments in poor condition can cause unnecessary frustration for your child and interfere with their success in music. Instruments from the internet and any general retail store are highly discouraged because the quality of the instrument cannot be guaranteed. Furthermore, with these instruments, you would be responsible for the cost of all repairs including broken strings, size upgrades, etc.

If you are considering purchasing or renting from another source, please discuss it with your child's director, in order to make an informed decision.

It is very important that students have an instrument in good playing condition with the proper set up. **Please see the back side of this sheet for District 303's recommended instrument vendors.**
