As we finish first semester, I want to wish everyone an enjoyable and well-deserved winter break. I hope you have the opportunity to connect with family and friends and spend time doing the things that bring you happiness.

Building Safety and Security - I am so very proud of our students for reaching out to East administration and the STCPD when a concerning social media post began circulating. We remind our students regularly, "If you see something or hear something, say something." Our students did just that, and they continue to be an important part of keeping our school community safe. Furthermore, there are other things we can do to keep our school safe that are simple, everyday actions. While driving in and around the East/Wredling campus, please be cautious and give pedestrians right of way as they are walking. This includes stopping for pedestrians in the crosswalks near East and observing posted speed limits. As a reminder, there is also a "No Left Turn" sign from Fighting Saints Drive onto Dunham Road. This is for the safety of our drivers and our students using the crosswalk at that location. Additionally, as a safety and security measure, we are reminding students to wear their current school IDs as they enter the building. We have been making it part of our morning routine. Please remind them to bring it with them and wear it in the building. We have been printing many IDs without charging students as of yet. Masking - Protecting opportunities for our students is very important to us. Please continue to reinforce the importance of wearing a mask - it is the best way for us to protect the experiences we want our students to have.

Student Recognition - In something that I don't recall happening at STCE, we had a student recognized for attaining a perfect score on an AP Exam. On last spring's AP Computer Science Exam, RJ De Guzman earned a perfect score! He was one of 356 students in the entire world to score a perfect score in the AP Computer Science Exam! In the [DuKane Conference Art Show](#), there were several students who were recognized for their outstanding work. Sarah Forsell was awarded first place in the Digital Illustration/Art category, Vanessa Slovik was awarded second place in the Painting category, Ben Cabel was awarded third place in the Drawing category, Gwendolyn Erwin was awarded third place in the Digital Illustration/Art category, and Evelyn Erwin was an Honorable Mention in the Sculpture & Jewelry category. In the VFW's Voice of Democracy contest, Alissa Chimienti was awarded third place, Allison Ollie fourth place, and Connor Eskeli an Honorable Mention. Our Interact club collaborated with the Rotary Club for their annual coat drive and helped purchase roughly \$8000 worth of coats for families in need. Finally, in cooperation with the Salvation Army, STCE participated in our annual Turkey Drive and Angel Tree Project, which certainly brightened the holiday season for hundreds of families in our community.

Performing Arts - Our students performed a series of vignettes titled *The Good Doctor* in October, and performed three amazing theatrical shorts during our Student Directed One Acts in November. Boys and Girls Cross Country, Girls Volleyball, and Boys Soccer were Regional Champions, and our Girls Golf and Boys and Girls Cross Country Teams qualified for their respective state competitions, with the Girls Cross Country Team finishing 8th in state and Micah Wilson winning the Boys Cross Country State Championship as an individual. Senior Sebastian Carranza was named the Kane County Preps Soccer Player of the Year and to the United Soccer Coaches High School All-American Team. In December, our ISO Team competed in the state bowling competition with Hayden Haneberg earning a fourth place ribbon and Kayle Brooks and Cullen Hand winning gold medals! Accessing Grades on HAC

The best way to access your child's grade is to click on CLASSES and the FULL VIEW button at the top right corner of the classwork pane. Under each class on the right side will be an option to SHOW ALL AVERAGES. Clicking that button will bring a pop-up that will display the student's overall grade. Some classes use grade categories that report information about student progress but may not impact the grade. Following these steps will ensure the grade you are seeing is the grade your child has in the class. Please refer to the accompanying screen shots as a guide.
