During the lessons, teachers incorporated their regular content into their new class. LRC/Media Specialist, Kerri Furlong, read the picture book "The Art Lesson," by Tomie dePaola, and then completed an art project. PE teacher, Julie Misner, taught a music lesson with lots of physical activity, making students move as they learned, sang, and played instruments. By the end of the lessons, the teachers confessed to students that it was only for a day. This experience, however, provided students and staff with a new perspective on the different content areas, and lasting memories.

Anderson and Lincoln students made some funny comments to describe the partial solar eclipse they witnessed on April 8: "It looks like a banana; it looks like a big toenail; it's getting dark!"

Eclipse activities varied across the District, from outdoor viewing to classroom projects and observing the NASA livestream.

At Corron, kindergarteners and 1st graders transformed their eclipse glasses into an Eclipse Mask with a special astronaut lens for safe eclipse viewing. Students designed and colored their masks, adding a personal touch to the experience, and Art Teacher, Rebecca Hubbs, secured the eclipse glasses to the mask with tape and elastic. Students in Haley Haneberg's 5th Grade STRIVE class used Oreo cookies as an interactive way to understand the change in moon phases. The class first watched informational videos and reviewed the names of the different phases and the order or process in which the moon changes. Then, students were given a worksheet with blank spaces to label the phases in the correct order and then had to use the Oreos and frosting to create a visual of the corresponding phase, making for a sweet and a bit messy learning activity.

Science classes at St. Charles North High School observed the celestial event with their eclipse glasses and used a telescope to enhance their learning experience. They took notes of what they observed and experienced, such as a temperature difference, how the light dimmed to a green/gray color, and commented on how the wind came to a halt.

In the art studio at Wild Rose, students got to take home their own eclipse drawing, which they created using black paper and chalk pastels.



Wredling Veterans' Food Drive

The Wredling Middle School Student Council, in partnership with Random Acts Matter, organized a Veterans' Food Drive during Random Acts of Kindness Week in February. This was an opportunity for the school community to come together to make a positive impact and express gratitude to those who have served our country.



Students encouraged the entire school community to participate, with the Wredling Builders Club and Student Support Services groups helping with the promotion, collection, and boxing of the food. Then, a team of veterans picked up, unloaded, sorted, and distributed the food to the local, homebound veterans in the Tri-City/South Elgin area, and the Hines VA Clinics in North Aurora and Hoffman Estates.



Notice to Destroy Special Education Records

Community Unit School District 303, in St. Charles, Illinois, set to destroy temporary special education paper records for former students. Temporary records of students who graduated or transferred out of district, and/or had inactive special education records, will be destroyed after June 1, 2024. Included in the destruction are documents from the school years of 2000-2010, and with the birth year of 1997. Also, included in the destruction are temporary records that have been digitized from the school years of 2018-19, 19-20, 20-21, 21-22, and 22-23. Also included are health records for students that graduated in 2020, 2021, and 2022 these records are maintained electronically. If a parent or student has reason to believe that these records may be of continued usefulness, they are encouraged to contact C.U.S.D. #303, Department of Student Services, 331-228-6732, to obtain a copy of these records, in accordance with the Illinois School Student Records Act, and relevant rules and regulations.

Special Education records may include reports of psychological or social work evaluations, reports of multi-disciplinary planning conferences, reports of annual reviews, copies of individual educational programs, or other verified information of clear relevance to the education of the student. Copies of the Rules and Regulations to Govern District 303 Student Records are available for inspection at each school site and at the District Central Office.
