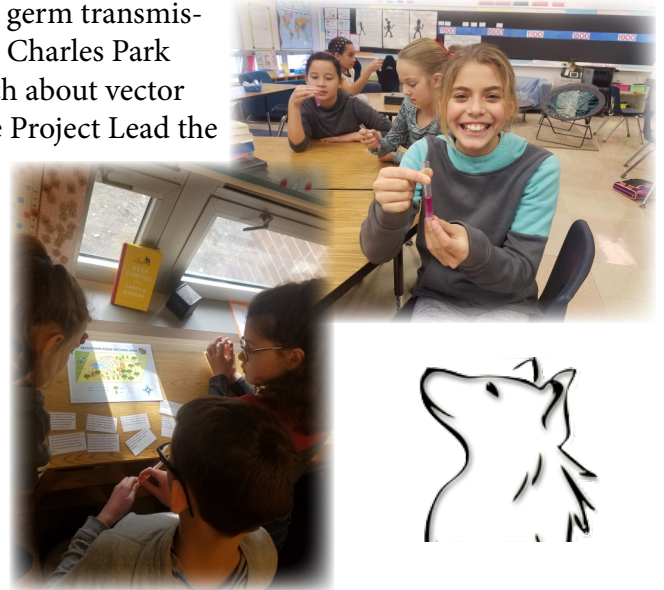


PLTW Infection Detection at Wasco



Fifth grade students at Wasco Elementary learned about germ transmission during a presentation by Lisa O'Brien from the St. Charles Park District. Mrs. O'Brien came into the classrooms to teach about vector and vehicle disease transmission in support of the fifth grade Project Lead the Way (PLTW) Infection Detection science unit.

Students used test tubes to pass a simulated germ around the class. They were excited to see who was 'infected'. Students also worked through a series of stations using deductive reasoning to determine the source of an illness. By looking at symptoms, they were able to determine where the disease was contracted and who else might have been affected. This interactive program is a wonderful collaboration with the park district in support of student learning.



TMS Orchestra Group Purchases Donation Items



Thompson Middle School's extracurricular orchestra group, IMPACT, purchased donation items for Rover Rescue and Snopko's Socks with the \$500 gift card they were awarded by the local Meijer store in St. Charles after their performance on December 16th.

For this holiday season, the students chose to sponsor Rover Rescue (a local dog rescue group) by providing them with much needed items. They also purchased dona-

Led by Orchestra Director, Angie Wifler, IMPACT's mission is to better the community through performance and service. “Discover-Y” Career Exploration Panel at East

St. Charles East High School's College and Career Readiness Department hosted its fourth “Discover-Y” series event on December 18, with a career exploration panel where various speakers from the community highlighted careers in Government, Public Administration, and Public Safety. As part of a new career awareness initiative, the monthly “Discover-Y” series event aims to expose students to an array of career opportunities.

The panel featured the U.S. Representative-elect, Lauren Underwood, the State's Attorney for Kane County, Joe McMahon, the Kane County Sheriff, Ron Hain, the Mayor of St. Charles, Ray Rogina, the Kane and DuPage County DUI Prosecutor, Kim DiGiovanni, Criminal Defense Attorney, Liam Dixon, ECC Program Coordinator of Paralegal Studies, Laura Haske, Circuit Judge, Clint Hull, Associate Judge, Elizabeth

Flood, and ECC Senior Director of Public Safety Training, John Fahy.

The speakers answered questions submitted by students and shared stories about the career paths that led them to their current positions. Panelists also highlighted some of the challenges within their fields that gave students insights about those careers. After the discussion, students posed for pictures with the speakers, and took the opportunity to share their stories, gather information for their government classes, and asked for college and career advice.

Each month the CCR Department highlights a different pathway based on student feedback. In September careers in education were highlighted; in October it was the health sciences and human services field; and in November it was careers in the military.

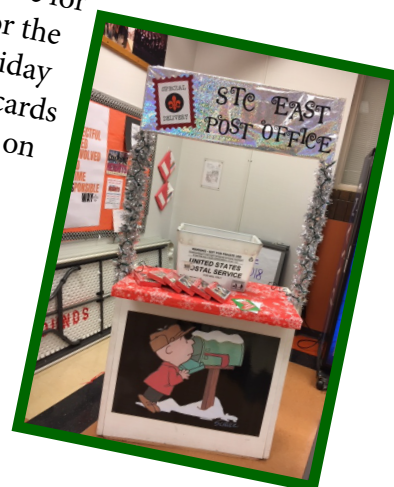

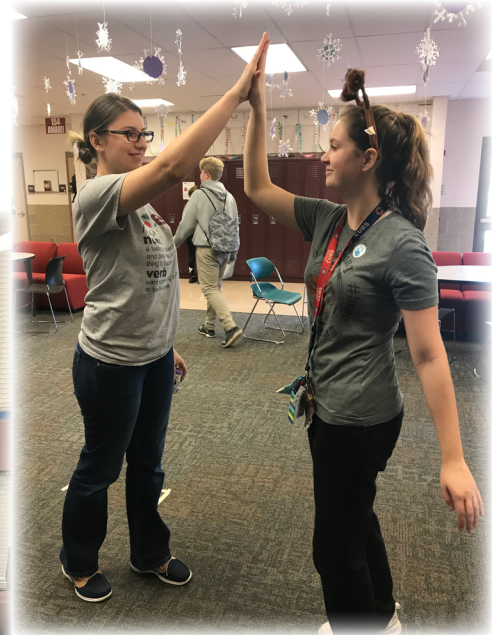
Turkey Drive Success at East High School

2019-2020 CUSD 303 Community Preschool Program Lottery

General Information:

For the 2019-2020 school year, District 303 will offer a five-day-a-week, ½ day, morning or afternoon preschool program. You will have the option to choose from the following locations: Fox Ridge or Ferson Creek School.

The program will be open to children who reside within the D303 school boundaries and who are 3-5 years old and are not eligible for Kindergarten.

The Preschool fee for the program is \$285 per month. A \$100 annual non-refundable registration and materials fee will also be required. *

*All fees are pending board approval

Come see our classrooms in action! Observational tours will be offered to all D303 community parents prior to registration.

Fox Ridge Tour: Wednesday, January 9, 2019 from 9:30-10:30 a.m. and from 1-2 p.m. (1905 Tyler Road, St. Charles)

Ferson Creek Tour: Friday, January 11, 2019 from 9:30-10:30 a.m. (38W160 Bolcum Road, St. Charles)

Enrollment Procedure:

Since space may be limited, an enrollment lottery for new preschool students will be held. *The enrollment lottery will be offered online on the district website (district.d303.org) from Tuesday, January 22, 2019 through Monday, February 4, 2019.*

Names will be drawn on Tuesday, February 5 and parents will be notified by email that day if their child was randomly selected. Registrants not chosen will be placed on a waiting list and will be notified when a space becomes available.

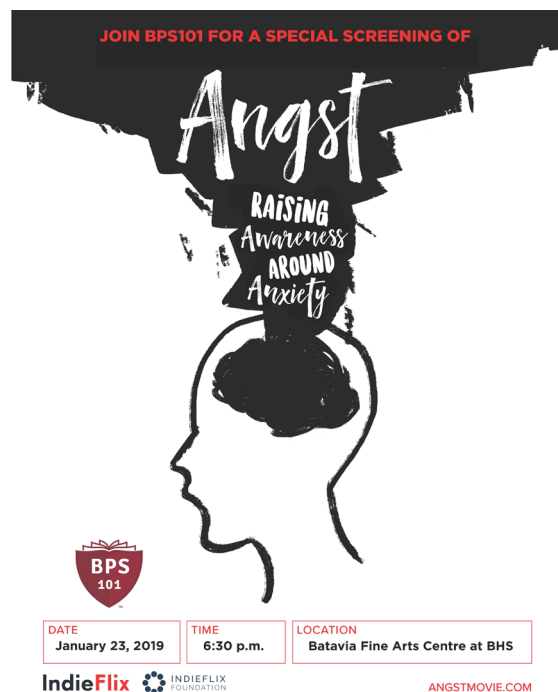


Free Screening of “Angst” at Batavia Fine Arts Centre

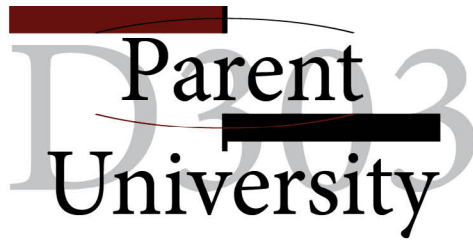

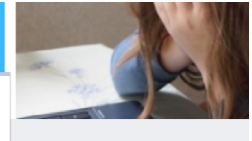

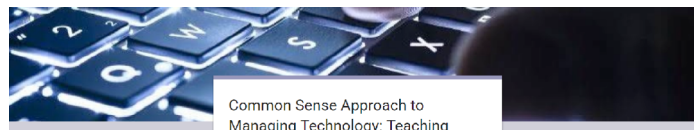
