Davis Primary Teacher Earns State Recognition

Davis second grade teacher Allison Thomas recently received an Award of Meritorious Service as part of the Illinois State Board of Education's (ISBE) Those Who Excel & Teacher of the Year Awards. Across the state, more than 500 educators were recognized for making a lasting impact on students, families, and co-workers in their respective school communities. Thomas and all of the other awardees will be celebrated by ISBE during a banquet on May 18, 2024.



"Being recognized for my passions that help each student grow is both rewarding and impactful," Thomas said. Flight Challenge at Richmond

As it's become a tradition, Richmond students in Maria Reece's 3rd grade participate in a flight challenge where they put their gliders to the test. Students designed and built their gliders applying the PLTW concepts they learned of lift, drag, thrust, and weight. Before the flight contest, they tested their models and recorded their observations in their PLTW launch logs. Then, they made improvements and modifications, changing the design or position of their wings and adjusting their stabilizers.



One by one, each glider was launched from a ramp by Mrs. Reece on February 12. She engaged students in discussions about each model and asked them to think critically and make predictions about how far they would fly. One student's glider made it as far as 13 feet, crowning them this year's winner of the flight challenge.



The following day, students went on a field trip to Avel Flight School at the DuPage Airport. They met with instructors and pilots, saw different airplanes, and even went through a flight simulator. Students commented how much they enjoyed the field trip as well as the hands-on project.

Students Recycle Over 1,000lbs of Plastic Film



Corron 5th grade teacher, Erik Robinson, and his students started a plastic film recycling program last year after learning about the negative effects plastic film has on the environment. Students collected plastic from each classroom on a weekly basis which they then weighed before Robinson dropped it off at Jewel Osco to be recycled through Trex (a sponsor of local recycling programs in communities throughout the country). Together, they recycled 250 pounds of plastic film.

This year, Robinson's class decided to continue the project and set a goal of recycling 1,000 pounds of plastic film. Students have done so much to engage and encourage the school community to participate, from creating educational videos and informative flyers, to partnering with the school's food service staff and custodian to properly separate and recycle the plastic. Because the class already reached its goal, they were awarded a Trex® furniture bench for the school. Students have expressed how exciting it has been to work on this project and how proud they are to be making a difference in the world.

Fourth graders got a taste of municipal government during a mock city council meeting. They discussed a hypothetical scenario involving a local candy store owner wanting to open a commercial candy shop in a residential neighborhood. Different students stepped into the roles of mayor, alderpersons, the aspiring business owner, Candace Sweetums, residents, city clerk, city administrator, and community development director.

City staff graciously coached and guided students as the students worked through the simulated meeting. Students reviewed maps and other information and asked questions related to storage, parking, and potential safety concerns.

"We are so grateful for the city doing this for us," expressed Norton Creek teacher Kris Hahn. "They really went above and beyond to make this experience happen for our students and we're excited for this amazing partnership."

Anderson Elementary celebrated the end of its One School One Book literary journey by hosting a family night on February 22. Anderson teachers came together to organize the escape room event with the theme around the book “Dragons in a Bag,” by Zetta Elliott.

Students participated in various activities that incorporated elements from the story, such as rock-wall climbing for quartz, digging for dinosaurs, and escaping dinosaurs to collect items necessary to get a transporter to work which allowed students to go home. There were also other challenges and craft and literacy activities for the whole family.



One School One Book spanned over three weeks at Anderson. Each family received a copy of the book and was encouraged to read one chapter each night and participate in daily trivia challenges. There was also a digital activity board that included chapter read alouds and supplemental materials to engage students and families further with what they were reading, helping them expand their learning and build stronger connections.


Empower Showcase at Richmond

In 3rd grade Build It!, students worked in small groups and used cardboard, plastic, and other materials to create a city installation with many iconic buildings found in St. Charles. In the same unit, 4th graders designed, engineered, and built awesome arcade games using recycled materials. The games were set up in the gym for all to enjoy, from a cool cardboard pool table and a double-player whac-a-mole to a mini golf course and an interactive pac-man game, and prizes for the winners. Fifth graders put their research skills and creativity to use as part of the FLEX module. Students created posters and PowerPoint presentations that focused on different countries and cultures around the world. This provided students with the opportunity to learn about different traditions, languages, and customs from around the world.
