Wow! What a great first quarter we have had at St. Charles East High School! Student spirit has been outstanding, participation levels extremely high, and our Saints pride has been ever present this fall, all of which was on full display during our very successful Homecoming Week! I am incredibly grateful for and proud of our students and school community for making the start of the 2022-23 school year one of the best ever!

Student Recognition - We are proud to announce that we have two National Merit Scholarship Semifinalists and eighteen National Merit Commended students. Hannah Wojcik was also a semi-finalist in the [Stossel in the Classroom Essay Contest](#). We also have 213 STCE students honored with being an AP Scholar, including 43 with Honors, 72 with Distinction, 1 with the AP Seminar & Research Certificate, and 8 students earning the AP Capstone Diploma.

Performing Arts - Over the summer, many current and recently-graduated STCE students wrote, directed, and produced original One Acts to raise funds for charities. *The Oregon Fail* by Elizabeth Nowak (2023) and Hannah Wojcik (2023) is about a mismatched group of students and teachers who get sucked into the *Oregon Trail*. *The New Therapist* by Jay Steinke (graduate) and Aaron Delaney (graduate) is a story about Sara's first day on the job as well as Charlie's first day searching for a new therapist. Will they find the perfect match? *Working Point* by Sam Uchill (2023) and Quinn York (graduate) is about a day in the life of your average movie theatre staff with all their trials and tribulations. Lastly, *You Thought You Escaped* by Levi Petrine (graduate) and Alex Pallan (graduate) is about a trip down memory lane to explore all the high school tropes you missed. They made a little over \$1700 which was donated to both the Trevor Project and the Breast Cancer Research Foundation. Our performing arts department will be continuing their series of performances of *Our Town* this weekend - here is [information](#) about the performance and tickets. We are also able to welcome our families and guests into the Norris Cultural Arts Center for music performances from our band, orchestra and vocal music students. 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Athletics - Athletically, our teams have been off to a great start and some have had a successful close to their seasons. The Kick-A-Thon was hosted at St. Charles North on Friday, October 7 during the cross-town football game. This is one of our biggest athletic events and an opportunity for East and North High School communities to come together to raise funds for families affected by cancer in our area. The STC ISO Team had a Bocce event in September where several athletes earned medals. Nate Borrico and Mitchell Hahn earned Gold medals, Natalie Glenn and Cecelia Glenn earned Silver medals, Bridget Nepil and Nolan Karrick earned Bronze medals, and Hayden Haneberg and Cullen Hand earned 4th Place! Emily Charles from our Girls Golf team qualified for the state tournament in Decatur and placed 21st overall at the two-day state competition!. From a social-emotional standpoint, we are responding to the data reported to us by students through the Panorama SEL screener from last year, which revealed an opportunity to strengthen the grit/perseverance of our students. Finally, PLCs have made a decision to engage in learning and application of strengthening the executive functioning skills of our students through note taking or initializing, prioritizing, and organizing.

Accessing Grades on HAC

The best way to access your child's grade is to click on CLASSES and the FULL VIEW button at the top right corner of the classwork pane. Under each class on the right side will be an option to SHOW ALL AVERAGES. Clicking that button will bring a pop-up that will display the student's overall grade. Some classes use grade categories that report information about student progress but may not impact the grade. Following these steps will ensure the grade you are seeing is the grade your child has in the class. Please refer to the accompanying screen shots as a guide.
