### EXAM WEEK INFORMATION – STUDY HALLS



Full period study halls will meet in their regularly scheduled locations. All lunch/study halls will meet in the Main Commons. Check-in with your study hall teacher. During exams, St. Charles East is still a closed campus. Students cannot leave campus and come back. If a student begins or ends the final exam day with a study hall, attendance in study hall is optional. Parents **do not** need to call the Attendance office to excuse their student. The student will automatically be excused. Students will only be permitted in the halls during passing periods. Therefore, students arriving in the middle of a testing period will be directed to the Main Commons.



### CHROMEBOOK COLLECTION

Freshman, Sophomores, Juniors — Upon the completion of your 5th hour exam on Friday, June 7, your teacher will be collecting Chromebooks and charging cords in your 5th hour classroom. If you do not have a 5th hour exam, you can return your Chromebook and charging cord to the LRC or to the station in the Main Commons anytime during exam week. If you do not return your Chromebook and charging cord prior to Summer Break you will be charged a replacement fee of \$250/\$20.

Exception: if you are in a Summer School course, in Project Synergy or you are completing a summer assignment for an AP Course in 2019-20, you may KEEP your Chromebook over the summer.

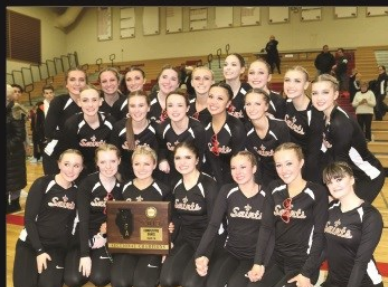

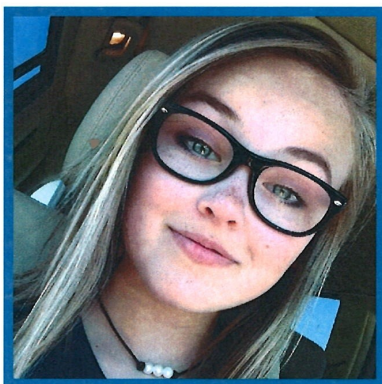
