Parent Satisfaction Survey - Available Dec. 3

Annually, District 303 conducts a satisfaction survey that gives us meaningful feedback from our students, teachers, and parents. For the last decade, we have administered a local survey that has provided us with comparable data.

Feed My Starving Children Event Totals

As part of Make A Difference St. Charles Day, students from St. Charles North High School coordinated the Feed My Starving Children Event at Aquascapes. Student groups from St. Charles North and St. Charles East, along with parents, students and staff members from around District 303 worked side by side on November 4 to pack meals that will be donated to needy children around the world. The event raised \$36,729.75 and the 700 volunteers packed 163,296 meals.



On the Job Students Help Shoppers at Barnes and Noble

For the last several years, transition students from both St. Charles East and St. Charles North High Schools, who are part of the On the Job Training (OJT) program, have participated in a fundraising event at Barnes and Noble in Geneva Commons. The funds go to purchase items that students need for the jobs they hold throughout the community.

Customers who purchase books and other items can get them gift wrapped by student volunteers. National Honor Society students from both high schools volunteer their time during this event and support the OJT students.



Denise Luecker, who is the vocational coordinator of OJT, said that this event provides transition students with the opportunity to engage with the community and share their work experiences. Students also get to use the skills they have learned like shaking hands, making eye contact, and working with their peers.



D303 United Team Receives Grant





Research shows that when parents talk to their children about the dangers of drugs and alcohol, and set expectations with open lines of communication, that children are less likely to abuse drugs and alcohol.

On December 4, Matthew Quinn, Licensed Counselor from Rosecrance will be our guest at a Parent University program entitled, "Talking to your Child about the Dangers of Drug and Alcohol Use." Mr. Quinn will provide parents with information and resources that will:

- Help them identify major risk factors for drug use among youth/adolescents
- Teach them the signs of drug use and appropriate responses
- Provide them with tools to implement practical steps that prevent children from gaining access to opioid drugs
- Increase awareness of trends and current terminology surrounding drug use
- Gain awareness of the long term health effects of vaping and e-cigarettes



The abuse of alcohol, tobacco, and illicit drugs are the leading cause of preventable accidents, premature death and disability among young people. While today's youth are among the most vulnerable in our communities for experiencing these adverse effects, research demonstrates that parent awareness and influence is critical in prevention and in getting the right help.

As part of this program, Nicole Cook, Mrs. America 2019 will share her personal story on how opioid abuse impacted her family in a tragic way.
