Here's how it works: First, you'll be asked to share your thoughts on a single question; second, you'll be asked to rate the thoughts of others; finally, you'll be able to discover the full conversation and ratings. The process is confidential, so identities will not be known or associated with the thoughts of others or their ratings. 

Compass Academy Students Participate in Manufacturing Month Tours

ompass Academy teamed with the St. Charles Area Chamber of Commerce's Industrial Committee to introduce students to a variety of manufacturing careers while connecting them with local companies, their products and to learn about their economic impact to the region. As part of Manufacturing Month, students toured three manufacturing facilities on October 26: Bison, Tek-Pak, and Pactiv.



During their visit to Bison Gear, students heard from the company president and lead engineers before taking a tour. During the question and answer session, they expressed curiosity about the manufacturing process, internship opportunities and the machines themselves.

At plastics and thermoform manufacturer Tek-Pak, students were led on a tour by Ben Carter. Students observed a "clean room" where food-grade and medical-grade items could be manufactured without being contaminated. They learned about how excess materials from production are recycled and reused and about the different types of careers on the manufacturing floor.

The tour day concluded at Pactiv, a manufacturer and distributor of food packaging and food service products. Students met with St. Charles Plant Manager Thanos Stavropoulos, Midwest

Regional Recruiter Desiree Medina and Human Resources Manager Jennifer Pesch. Pactiv products include paper cups, trays, and containers for businesses like Starbucks, Wendy's, Subway and others. Prior to the tour, students heard a brief presentation and engaged in a question and answer session.

"The sheer production, the way everything works is just amazing," expressed Zakariah Sreanovich, a senior at Compass Academy who plans to attend Purdue University and study motorsports engineering.

Manufacturing Month provides an opportunity to highlight the industry's many contributions to the state and local community. Submit to the Community Backpack

District 303 distributes information electronically from non-profit organizations, intergovernmental agencies and business partners for which it grants approval. Information can be posted on this Community Backpack webpage throughout the school year. Those wishing to submit information to be posted must do so electronically by emailing a completed CB Flyer Request Form and a PDF of the requested posting to the District 303 Administration Center, in care of Janelle Magana at least ten

days in advance of the desired posting date. Additionally, when submitting the first posting request of the school year, a completed Certificate of Not-For-Profit Status Form must also be completed and submitted with a copy of the groups 501(c)3 certificate.

Prior to submitting, please read details regarding our distribution guidelines. The decision to post is at the discretion of District 303 administrators, based on these guidelines.



Does your District 303 Student Have a Library Card?

District 303 students who live outside of the St. Charles Public Library District can receive a Student Library Card if they are not eligible for a card at another public library. The partnership between SCPL and District 303 is now in its fourth year. With a Student Library Card, users can access library resources, including checking out books, accessing eBooks, and using research databases. Those who are interested and eligible can opt-in during the school registration process or contact the District during the school year.
