Corron Students Organize Food Drive to Help Families in Need

During the week of January 25, Corron 5th grade students helped collect over 1,800 food items through their school-wide food drive, benefiting Food For Greater Elgin. After learning about poverty, homelessness, hunger, and other social issues in class, and realizing how the current COVID pandemic negatively impacted families, students expressed to their teacher, Mr. Grimman, how they wanted to do something to help others.

“At first, they simply wanted to donate money but I asked them to go a little deeper and see what they were truly willing and wanting to do,” said 5th grade teacher Mr. Grimman. “Students then decided that a school-wide food drive was the answer to help the community.”

As a class, they reached out to a couple of local food pantries and, with the guidance of Interim Executive Director, Michael Montgomery, they were able to start the food drive at their school to support Food For Greater Elgin. During their initial phone call, he answered all the questions students had and challenged them to collect enough food items to equate their teacher’s weight.

With that goal in mind, students reached out to the principal, Mrs. Balaskovits, who answered additional questions they had about organizing this event at Corron and demonstrated her full support.

“The support from Corron families was also amazing because they helped us surpass our goal,” added Mr. Grimman.

On February 3, Food For Greater Elgin staff and Michael Montgomery visited Corron to collect all the food item donations. They were extremely grateful for all the food and appreciated how the community came together to help support those families in need during these difficult times.



When Art Reflects Life

When Rebecca Hubbs was an art teacher at Wredling Middle School she would select 10–12 pieces from the school year to be a part of the Wredling Permanent Art Collection. When the students reach their senior year in high school, Mrs. Hubbs retires the piece back to them. This year, a piece done by a student who was new to Wredling in 8th grade seemed to be a sign of things to come.

Valeria Rybkina's piece titled *Colour Windows*, which was created using Crayola Construction Paper Crayons, includes a drawing of a young woman wearing a mask. When Valeria created the piece during the 2016–2017 school year, she could not have known how timely her drawing would be in 2020–2021.

Five years after its creation, Mrs. Hubbs asked Valeria why she drew the figure with a mask. Valeria replied, "I really didn't think I could draw faces that well and so I

drew a mask." She continued to say, "It also represented the fact that I couldn't speak English very well, or at least then I couldn't but now I can."

Valeria's mom said that this piece is one of her favorites, so Mrs. Hubbs is happy to be able to return it home to the artist.



District 303 Notice of Destruction of Special Education Records

The temporary special education records of former students of Community Unit School District 303, St. Charles, records are set to be destroyed. Students who graduated or transferred out of the district with a date of birth year of 1993–1994 records will be destroyed after March 1, 2021. If a parent or student has reason to believe that these records may be of continued usefulness, they are encouraged to contact the District 303, Department of Instruction, Instructional Interventions, at (331)228-6732, to obtain these records.

Special Education records may include: reports of psychological or social work evaluations, reports of multi-disciplinary planning conferences, reports of annual reviews, copies of individual educational programs, or other verified information of clear relevance to the education of the student. Copies of the Rules and Regulations to Govern District 303 Student Records are available for inspection at each school site and at the District Central Office.

Davis Students Connect with Science Book Author

On February 2, first grade students at Davis Primary had the awesome opportunity to connect with Melissa Stewart, author of over 180 science-themed nonfiction books for children. Her presentation included information about how she finds inspiration for new books and that sometimes it takes up to 6 years to finish one. She also expressed to students that with dedication and hard work, they can achieve anything to which they set their minds.

Mrs. Martinez's students could not contain their excitement, as they asked questions about all their favorite books, with topics ranging from reptiles and birds to fossils and space science. The class wondered how Ms. Stewart knew so much and how she came up with all the interesting facts in her books. She encouraged students to research topics in which they were

interested. She also shared that students should read other books, research on the internet, interview experts, such as scientists, and observe the world around them to better understand what's happening.

Additionally, she provided students with nonfiction writing resources to help them with their nonfiction writing project, and even left some 1st graders inspired to become scientists!



INCubator and ACCErator Students Move Forward with Business Ideas

St. Charles East INCubator and ACCErator students met virtually with community mentors and judges for a live Q&A to help them improve their innovative business products and ideas in preparation for the Final Pitch Night. Prior to the virtual meeting, students shared their MVP video pitches with mentors and judges. Student entrepreneurs detailed information about their product or service, customer persona, and their plans to continue to move forward with their businesses: What Not Flower Shop, Shoe Stop, Fog Shield, ForEx, ThermoStick, and Xtended Comfort.

During the virtual meeting, Business Education teacher, Mr. Glavan welcomed judges and consultants Christine Flood, (St. Charles Public Library Business Reference Librarian); Michael Kayman, (Special Opportunity Value Fund LC President); and Laura Mackline-Purdy (St. Charles Business Alliance Tourism & Sales Manager). Although not in attendance, Brent Nakayama (Program Manager & Energy Consultant at Leidos Engineering) provided great feedback and support to students prior to the virtual meeting. Community mentors Lula Cassidy (President and CEO of InnTerActive Marketing), and Eric Jens (Frehner Jens LCC Co-founder and Managing Partner), as well as Business Education teacher, Mrs. Stone were also involved.



For some students, the current COVID-19 pandemic presented an opportunity to develop new ideas to help people based on their current lifestyle changes. One group developed Fog Shield, a thin film placed on glasses to prevent them from fogging when wearing glasses with a face mask.

Xtended Comfort (with their unique armrest design), had to modify their initial product to take into consideration the safety protocols in place during flights and appeal to people's concerns for cleanliness and disinfection.

The constructive feedback received from the judges will help students refine their business products and services before moving into market research, product adjustments, and prototype samples.

District 303 Nurses Continue to Serve the Community During the COVID Pandemic

Administering the COVID-19 Vaccine to the very staff members they work side by side with each school day has marked a milestone toward pandemic recovery for our district nurses. School nurses in D303 have volunteered before and after their school work day to provide vaccines and monitor participant response at the Kane County Vaccine Clinics. Many of our school nurses belong to the Medical Reserve Corps which has provided them with extensive emergency training.

Norton Creek in-person and remote students had an incredible time during their “Dogsledding Virtual Assembly,” an online expedition guided by explorers Dave and Amy Freeman. Through their presentations and online expeditions, they seek to inspire kids to get outside to explore, learn about nature and the world, all while learning valuable life skills.




Not only were students able to learn about what it’s like to explore the winter wilderness by dogsled, but they also learned about the dogs, how they’re trained, and the equipment and gear Dave and Amy use to keep warm in the below-freezing temperatures. Students were very excited when they met sled dog, Iris. They learned all about how strong she and the other dogs are, how they fit into their harnesses, and the long training process.

As Dave talked about their adventures and trips, he also shared how important their Expedition ABC’s are: Attitude, Believe, Care, Do your Best, and Exercise. He believes these life skills help students develop important characteristics inside and outside of the classroom. While dog sledding, Dave, Amy, and the dogs need to work together, maintain a positive attitude, and believe in each other to reach their destination.
