ATHLETIC BOOSTERS - SCHOLARSHIP



The STC East Athletic Boosters have voted to increase the scholarships they offer to graduating seniors for the class of 2019. This year, the Boosters will select five (5) winners and each chosen winner will receive \$1,500 toward their college or vocational tuition!

To be eligible, the student must have participated in at least two years of a sport or sport support activity, be in the top 1/2 of their class and NOT be receiving a full-ride athletic scholarship. Also, to be eligible, the student's parent or guardian must be a Booster Member in good standing. More details can be found within the application itself. The deadline for this scholarship application is Wednesday, April 3, 2019 - no exceptions. PTO SCHOLARSHIP

The PTO will be granting four \$1,000 scholarships to graduating Seniors who plan to continue their education at a university, junior college or vocational school and whose parents are PTO members. Applications are available in the College and Career Office, on the school website and on Naviance. Completed applications must be postmarked on or before April 8, 2019.

Do not bring a cellphone, food or drink, books, homework or any other non-test related materials.

Seniors will have a non-attendance day and are encouraged to work on their scholarship applications or essays, complete volunteer hours or arrange a job shadow. English teachers and school counselors will be in the Main Commons to assist Seniors with their scholarship essays and applications on a drop-in basis.
