From the Principal

SAEBRS (Social Academic and Emotional Behavior Rating Scale) Screener

Please see my letter below regarding a new assessment tool we will use this year to help meet the needs of our students:

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Community Unit School District 303 strives to provide all students with the best opportunity to succeed academically, socially, and behaviorally in school. As part of this commitment, District 303 is enhancing our Multi-Tiered Systems of Supports (MTSS) in several schools for the 2018-2019 school year.

Munhall Elementary School has been selected as an early implementation site, which means that teachers will be completing a universal screening tool to assess the academic, social, and emotional learning skills of all students. The use of universal screening allows us to refine and strengthen our efforts to help all students achieve success by taking positive and preventative

measures as early as possible. This also provides us with the opportunity to assist students who may need additional supports with academic, social, and emotional learning.

One of the universal screening tools used by the District is the Social Academic and Emotional Behavior Rating Scale (SAEBRS), which focuses on the following areas:

- *Social (e.g., Arguing, Temper Outbursts, Disruptive Behavior)*
- *Emotional (e.g., Sadness, Anxiety, Withdrawal, Lack of Resilience)*
- *Academic (e.g., Academic Engagement, Production of Acceptable Work, Preparedness).*

Teachers will administer the SAEBS on October 5, 2018. If a screening shows that a student will benefit from additional skill development, parents will be contacted and will work in collaboration with school staff to problem-solve and determine next steps.

It's Recorder Time . . .

Dear Fourth Grade Parents,

All fourth grade students will begin learning how to play the soprano recorder, the 2nd week in October, during music class. Each 4th grade student will need:

- 1 – Soprano Recorder – preferred Item #: **YRS-24B – Yamaha Recorder** (ordering information follows)
- 1 – Music folder and pencil (most students already have these in their classroom)

The recorder was on the 4th grade supply list, so if you have already purchased one for your child, or your child already has one from their older sibling, please have your child bring the recorder to music the 2nd week in October.

If your child does not have a recorder, you may:

Purchase the Yamaha YRS-24B recorder from an online retailer, such as Amazon, or via phone through Quinlan & Fabish Music Company. The price through Quinlan and Fabish is \$10.00, including delivery to school.

ORDERS THROUGH QUINLAN AND FABISH MAY NOT BE PLACED UNTIL OCTOBER 1.

Recorders will then be delivered by the sales representative to Munhall. If ordering your child's recorder through Quinlan & Fabish Music Company, please follow the below instructions:

- 1. Please call 1-630-654-4111**, for the Burr Ridge location of Quinlan & Fabish, to pay by credit or debit card (store hours are Monday through Thursday 8:00 am- 7:30 pm, Friday 8:00 am- 4:30 pm, and Saturday 9:00 am- 3:30 pm, closed on Sundays)
- 2. Please include your child's class section when placing your order**
("4C"- Carter, "4H"- Henning, "4M"- Milella, or "4S"- Shumaker)
- 3. Please instruct customer service to have Paul Ramsaier deliver the recorder to Munhall.** (Paul Ramsaier is the representative that services our District 303 schools.)

****Please place your order by Friday, October 5**, to ensure your child's recorder arrives in time for your child to begin playing with the rest of the class!**

Mrs. Hammons will then distribute the recorders ordered through Quinlan and Fabish during music class.

*****Please DO NOT send your child to school with a check! ALL ORDERS MUST BE PLACED ONLINE, through Amazon or other online retailers directly, OR VIA PHONE through Quinlan & Fabish!!**

Students will be asked to practice their recorders for 10 minutes, five days a week. Encouraging your child to practice may be the first step in developing a young musician! I look forward working with your child!
