What is Scholastic Bowl?

Scholastic Bowl is a game in which two teams compete head-to-head to answer questions from all areas of knowledge, including history, literature, science, fine arts, current events, popular culture, sports, and more. The defining feature of Scholastic Bowl is the use of a “buzzer system” that lets players interrupt the reading of a question when they know the answer. That element adds a dimension of confidence, anticipation, and rapid recall to a game about knowing facts. Answering with speed leads to opportunity for more points!





HOW TO WEAR A FACE MASK

Proper face mask usage is important to prevent the spread of illness. This includes proper techniques for wearing the mask, taking it on and off, and storing it.

HOW TO PROPERLY PUT YOUR MASK ON

1



Wash your hands with soap and water or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer before touching the mask.

2



If your mask has ear loops, use the ear loops to secure behind your ears.

3



If your mask has ties, bring the mask to nose level and tie the top straps across the upper part of your head, above the ears. Bring the mask over your mouth and under your chin. Once it is secure, tie the lower straps behind your neck.

4



Mold or pinch the area around your nose so the mask fits securely. Make sure it covers both your nose and chin.

Helpful Tips



- Do not touch the front of the mask.
- Do not forget to cover your chin.
- Do wear it securely over your nose, from the bridge of your nose to below your chin.
- Do make sure it is fastened securely and fits snugly on both sides, with no gaps.

HOW TO REMOVE A FACE MASK

1



Wash your hands thoroughly with soap and water or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.

2



Do not touch the front of the mask.

3



Use the ear loops to remove the mask. If your mask has ties, untie the bottom string first, then the top, and use the ties to pull the mask away from your face.

4



Properly dispose of your mask if necessary, or store it safely. Clean your hands.

Helpful Tips



- Wash and dry cloth masks daily.
- Store masks in a clean, dry location, like a paper bag. They should be carefully folded so that the outer surface faces inward.
- Make sure to clean hands before and after handling your mask.
- If you use a disposable mask, be sure to dispose of it properly.

McKinney-Vento Children– Who are they?

McKinney-Vento eligible children are those who lack a fixed, regular and adequate nighttime abode. In general, children or youth living in motels, transitional housing, shelters, the street, cars, abandoned buildings, and other inadequate accommodations may be considered eligible for McKinney-Vento services. This includes, but is not limited to, the following groups:

Doubled-up Children	living with another family due to lack of a permanent residence
Children in Shelters	including transitional living programs
Children Living in Motels	due to lack of alternative adequate living situation
Migratory Children	if accommodations are not fit for habitation
Runaways*	children who have left home and live in a shelter or inadequate accommodations, even if parents are willing to provide a home
Lockouts*	children whose parents or guardians will not permit them to live at home

- *These two categories are Unaccompanied Homeless Youth (UHY), child not in the physical custody of their parent or court-ordered guardian and lack a fixed, regular and adequate abode.*

McKinney-Vento Children– What are their rights?

The Education for Homeless Children and Youth program, as part of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act ensures eligible children have the right to:	
Choice of School	McKinney-Vento Eligible children may attend their school of origin (school last attended or school attended when child lost permanent housing) or attend the school that serves their temporary living situation. Their Caregiver makes the choice.
Immediate Enrollment	even if medical or other records, birth certificates, transcripts, cannot be produced at time of enrollment
Transportation	if requested, transportation must be provided
Preschool	priority consideration to preschool programs for eligible youngsters
Free Lunch & Fee Waivers	categorically eligible for free lunch
Access to remote learning	including meals, devices and WIFI access
Supplemental tutoring	if needed
