Grant Helps Lincoln Grow Playground Options

The warmer weather brings more opportunities for students to have outdoor recess. And at Lincoln, students were very excited to go outside and play together in their newly installed GaGa Ball Pit.


Principal Michelle Woodring expressed how they wanted to get more recess equipment for the school and be able to offer different game options for kids during recess. After much research and preparation, they submitted a grant proposal last fall through the Making Kane County Fit for Kids program. The program’s Jackie Forbes presented Woodring with the check earlier this year for the \$6,529.65 grant.

Woodring then worked with Coach Cliff’s GaGa Ball Pits to have the ADA compliant equipment installed and students finally had the opportunity to use it for the first time on April 14. Once the ball was tossed in the center of the playing area, students chanted “GaGa Ball” and then began playing. The game consists of keeping the ball in the playing area and using only one hand, players have to hit the ball off the walls and knock another player below the knee. Students laughed and cheered each other on as they played, with the “last player standing” being named the winner of that round.



The City of St. Charles offers a career pathway job shadow program to St. Charles East and North High School students interested in exploring a career in municipal government. Recently, an East Freshman student met with Lieutenant Steve Rehak from the St. Charles Fire Department for an opportunity to learn all about his job and experience as a firefighter and paramedic.

Lieutenant Rehak took the student on a tour of the fire station where they could see other firefighters go about their daily jobs and routines. He shared how the fire station is their home and they treat it as such, noting how they're able to develop stronger relationships and help each other improve, stay motivated, and trust each other as they go about doing their jobs. "There's a lot of trust placed in us," he remarked, and continued to discuss all the required tests and certifications applicants must pass before they're considered to join the department. As they concluded the tour, the student even had the opportunity to try on Lieutenant Rehak's uniform, including all the equipment firefighters have to carry with them when faced with a real fire, which can weigh over 30lbs.



Students may schedule up to three different job shadow experiences per school year, during which they can explore work sites, ask questions, see demonstrations, and learn about education and certifications. Students are able to explore careers such as electrician, police officer, lab technician, tree maintenance, or positions in IT/Networking.

From the City of St. Charles: The high school job shadow program was first launched in late 2019. As the City redesigned the program, they explored different ways to give participating students a more personalized experience. After the program was put on hold in late 2019 due to the COVID-19 pandemic, they re-launched it in late 2021. Since then, the City of St. Charles has hosted over 60 job shadows with 39 different students from St. Charles North High School, St. Charles East High School, Kaneland High School (Fox Valley Career Center), Batavia High School (FVCC), Geneva High School, and Jacobs High School.
