How Do I Know if I Am READY for an Honors or AP Course?

- Have you earned excellent grades in the academic area in which you are seeking a challenge?
- Do your standardized test scores fall in the top 5% (or better) in the general subject and its sub tests?
- Are you a disciplined student? Do you complete all homework assignments? How well do you prioritize your time?

What Academic Level Works Best for Me?

- Talk as a family to determine what works best for you as an individual – your skills, goals and aspirations.
- Consider how you balance academic/homework, family, athletic/co-curricular and other responsibilities.

Academic Success in High School

Graduation Requirements

All Students must earn a minimum of 23 credits.

- **English:** 4 credits (8 semesters @ .5 credit per semester)
- **Mathematics:** 3 credits
- **Science:** 2 credits
- **Social Studies:** 2 ½ credits (must include a Geographic Foundations Course, U.S. History, and Government)
- **Economics** (or its equivalent) .5 credits
- **PE/Health/Drivers' Education:** 4 credits
- **Electives:** 7 credits

Expectations of Students

Each student is expected to do the work that is necessary to be successful in his or her academic courses.

- Be responsible for assignments and due dates.
- Do homework regularly, carefully, and completely.
- Seek adult support when coursework is confusing or overwhelming.
- Be a participant in and take ownership of his/her education.
- Understand the requirements for his/her preferred future.

Important Dates in the Course Selection Process

- Course Selections through HAC are due **January 16th.**
- School Counselors will be meeting with Wredling students on January 19th & Thompson students on January 26th. Makeups will be completed virtually as needed.
- Course Verification Forms will be due February 14, 2023.
