School Hours: 8:40 a.m. – 3:00 p.m.

- Doors open at 8:25am
- Students must be in class by 8:40am
- Please do not drop off your child before 8:25 a.m. We do not have supervision before that time. Students will be dismissed from their classrooms at 3:00 p.m.

Visitors/Volunteers: All parent visitors and volunteers will enter the school through the main office and will need to present a valid driver's license to be scanned into our Raptor System for a visitor's badge.

To Report an Absence:



1. Call the Anderson Attendance Line: 331-228-3300 AND
2. Email your child's classroom teacher.

Student Early Dismissal:

1. Call the office at 331-228-3300 before noon AND
2. Send a note with student or email classroom teacher with time of pick up

Car Rider Requests: If on a given day your child is not to ride the bus home, parents MUST call the office ahead of time (BEFORE 12:00 NOON) to ensure the child does not get on the bus.

Lunch Account:

1. Visit www.pushcoin.com and deposit money directly into your child's lunch account.
2. You may also send in a check made payable to "CUSD 303" or cash in an envelope marked "Lunch Money" with student's name.
3. If a student has a negative balance greater than \$5.00 – they will receive a sun butter and jelly lunch option.

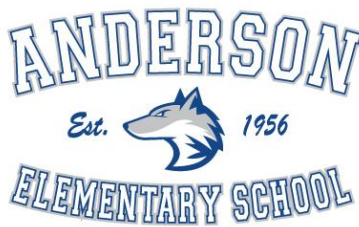
Dear Anderson Families,

We are pleased to share information with you about enhanced security measures and procedures that have been put in place in all District 303 schools.

When you visit our schools, you will notice interior locked vestibule glass doors and windows that allow for more secure entrances. During the school day, we ask that visitors come the main school entrance, press the buzzer, stand in front of the camera before identifying themselves and providing the reason for their visit. Visitors will be buzzed into the vestibule by school staff. Items such as lunches, homework, or instruments may be left on shelves in the vestibule and will be brought into the school by a staff member. Paperwork that needs to be dropped off may be placed in the slot at the window. If a visitor needs to come into the office or building for a specific reason, the individual will be asked to present identification that will be scanned into an electronic visitor management system. When visitors have to enter the school for any reason, they will be issued a temporary ID to wear while in the building and will be asked to check in the office for direction.
