Corron's Earthquake-Resistant Structures



Implementing a Hands-On Standards STEM in Action project within the weather and natural disasters unit, third grade students at Corron Elementary worked on building structures that could withstand an earthquake.

To determine which types of earthquake technologies would best support their structures, students followed the engineering design process, consisting of finding a problem, planning a solution, making a model, testing the model, reflecting and redesigning it, and sharing their findings.

Applying their math skills, students held a “budget meeting,” where they discussed the types of earthquake technologies they needed that followed criteria such as price and cost of the project, height of the building, and the requirement of two different earthquake technologies to use on the structure, such as the single-cross brace or the X braces.

The technologies had different prices and students had to calculate which technologies they could afford to make an earthquake-resistant building.

Some students were under budget and added additional supports to their buildings. Others had to determine which parts were most essential, as they were significantly over budget. Once students determined a final cost that was under budget, they began building.

After the buildings are created, they will test the technology using an earthquake shake table to simulate an earthquake. They will compare their building and the sway time to one without any earthquake technologies and will share their findings with the rest of the groups.



20 Days of Kindness Campaign at East



Throughout the school year, St. Charles East Student Council members who serve on the Hospitality Committee plan activities aimed at building a sense of community for students and staff members.

In November and December, students created a “20 Days of Kindness” campaign where they developed a daily random acts of kindness calendar that encouraged participation from everyone in the school. Some of the acts included complimenting someone, paying it forward, and volunteering.

Student Council members Adrianna Stanke and Alexis Cornille brought an idea to the committee to organize a donation drive to benefit the Anderson Animal Shelter. After contacting the animal shelter for approval, students created flyers that listed items the shelter needed, and set up donation areas in the school.

Before winter break, Student Council members volunteered at the annual “Special Night for Special Kids,” where they helped children with special needs play games and decorate cookies. Volunteers dressed up as elves, Minions and Disney characters greeted children as they came into Davis School.



During the remainder of the school year, committee members will plan service projects and activities such as the St. Baldrick’s event and the annual “See-Saw-A-Thon” for the Thomas-McBride Memorial.

Preschool Program Lottery

General Information:

For the 2019-2020 school year, District 303 will offer a five-day-a-week, ½ day, morning or afternoon pre-school program. You will have the option to choose from the following locations: Fox Ridge or Ferson Creek School.

The program will be open to children who reside within the D303 school boundaries and who are 3-5 years old and are not eligible for Kindergarten.

The Preschool fee for the program is \$285 per month. A \$100 annual non-refundable registration and materials fee will also be required. *

*All fees are pending board approval

Enrollment Procedure:

Since space may be limited, an enrollment lottery for new preschool students will be held. The enrollment lottery will be offered online on the [district website](#) from Tuesday, January 22, 2019 through Monday, February 4, 2019.

Names will be drawn on Tuesday, February 5 and parents will be notified by email that day if their child was randomly selected. Registrants not chosen will be placed on a waiting list and will be notified when a space becomes available.


