From the Principal.....Tony White

There is research cited by Elena Aguilar in her book, "Onward," that connects the feeling of joy to our overall resilience. There is even more research by noted sociological researcher (and a personal favorite of mine), Brene Brown, that connects gratitude to our ability to feel joy. This makes a lot of sense when we think about it. Our ability to recognize the awesome in our lives and that things are better than they seem is connected to our ability to feel that deep resonance of joy. So, why do things sometimes seem worse than they are? It actually has to do with the neurology of our brains. Our brains have what is called a "negativity bias," and it can make it really difficult for us to see the positive. Negative stimuli is processed by the brain 120 times more quickly than positive. It only takes a tenth of a second for something we perceive as "danger" to be lodged in our memories as opposed to 12 seconds of focus for a memory to be stored as a positive. It's linked to our ancestors' survival as they were much more exposed to nature and did not have the technology that we have today that keeps us safer.

So, why would I write about this topic in this week's eNews? It has to do with our kids' resilience (and even looking a bit at our own as we model positive strategies and resilience-building for our children). As we take those precious moments to process our kids' day at school with them, let's help them realize all of the positive things they have done and been a part of. We should also remember to take the things they perceive as "not-so-good" seriously, but to help them process it to keep it in its perspective. When those not-so-good things come up, we are always happy to help if you need it and are a phone call or E-Mail away.

As we move forward this school year, let's focus on the awesome and use that resilience we build to surmount any challenges with our Eagles. In doing so, we strengthen our relationships with our kids and empower them today and in the future.
