Pro-tip #1 from the East Yearbook Staff: If you are only interested in a Yearbook photo, you can skip the sitting fee and get the photo done with a single pose. Please get photographed during the summer!

Pro-tip #2 from the East Yearbook Staff: Your Senior student can wear semi-formal clothing for their ID photo (at Materials Pick-up) and the resulting photo will be almost identical to the formal photos.

Missed dates: If a Senior is not photographed by Root Studios, we will use the Senior ID photo taken at registration. Many Seniors are portrayed this way each year, and the end result is consistent. Please get photographed during the summer! After the November 1, 2019 deadline – ID photos are the only option for making sure Seniors are pictured in the yearbook. We do not use any photos taken outside of Root Studios/ID photos.



PARKING PERMIT APPLICATIONS:

Seniors (**Class of 2020**) interested in every day parking on campus during 2019-20 **MUST** turn in their parking permit application (pink sheet) and have all their registration/course/parking fees paid by the deadline of Wednesday, July 17, 2019. If there are more applications received than available spaces, a lottery will be used to determine who has the opportunity to park every day. Seniors who will be issued an Everyday Hang Tag will receive an e-mail prior to Materials Pick-up days. Seniors who do not get an Everyday Hang Tag may have the option to purchase two hang tags for the Driver's Ed Range (Odd/Even) after the start of school for the price of two Range tags. This Odd/Even possibility will only be offered based on availability.

Juniors (**Class of 2021**) will have the opportunity to purchase an Odd or Even Hang Tag for the Driver's Ed Range. Juniors need to turn in their parking permit application (pink sheet) and pay all their registration/course/parking fees by the deadline of Wednesday, July 17, 2019 prior to receiving their hang tag at Materials Pick-up. If more applications are received than spaces available, there will be a lottery to determine who will receive a parking permit.

If more applications are received than spaces available, there will be a lottery to determine who will receive a parking permit. There will be **NO** special consideration for students involved in clubs, extra-curricular activities or other non-school related activities (jobs, babysitting, sports, etc.). Every year there are more students that apply for parking permits than available parking spaces. A lottery is very likely.

No freshman or sophomores will be issued parking permits. In addition to the risk of being towed, freshman and sophomores that park illegally on campus put their permit chances for Junior year in jeopardy.

Submitting an application and paying all fees by Wednesday, July 17, 2019 does not guarantee a parking permit. Every year there are more students that apply for parking permits than available parking spaces.

STATION 1—PICK UP PAID FEE RECEIPT

Pick up your paid fee receipt at Station 1 in order to proceed through all the stations.

NOTE: IF YOU HAVE NOT PAID YOUR FEES, COMPLETE STATIONS 2, 3 AND 4 THEN PROCEED TO THE SCHOOL TREASURER LOCATED IN THE STUDENT ACTIVITIES AREA JUST OUTSIDE OF THE MAIN COMMONS.

STATION 2—STUDENT PLANNER & FREE LANYARD

Each student is required to sign a signature page showing receipt of both the Planner and the directions to view the discipline policy/student handbook.

Wearing student IDs is required/School Board policy — stop by for your free lanyard!

STATION 3—VOTER REGISTRATION, INSURANCE INFORMATION, TESTING INFORMATION, and PSAT RESULTS

STATION 4—HOMECOMING INFORMATION

Student and parent signatures are needed on the Homecoming Waiver if a student plans to participate in the parade, float building, spirit assemblies, etc.

STATION 5 – BOOSTER ORGANIZATIONS & SPIRIT WEAR

These support organizations provide valuable services and student scholarships. Please consider becoming a member today! Buy some 2019-20 East spirit wear!

STATION 6— SENIOR HANDPRINTS

Seniors! Stop by the Main Commons and leave your handprint and signature on the wall. August 6 and August 12 will be the only days you will be able to do so.

STATION 7—BUS ROUTES

Bus information for high school students will be available on-line starting August 12. Visit the district's Bus Route E-Link located at www.d303.org under the "For Parents" menu. Call 331-228-5180 if you have any questions.

STATION 8—QUEST FOOD SERVICE

Stop by to check out the school lunch menu for the first few weeks of school.

STATION 9 - SCHOOL NURSE/HEALTH FORMS

Seniors: you must turn in verification of the required Meningococcal Vaccination. **Freshmen:** you must turn in the required 9th grade physical/required immunizations form.

STATION 10 - STUDENT I.D. & FRESHMAN, SOPHOMORE AND JUNIOR YEARBOOK PHOTOS

A student identification card with the student's name and picture will be issued to all students. This identification card will be needed to pick up textbooks and is used as a bus pass, Learning Resource Center card, and for activity entrance. **Students are to wear this card during school hours and bring to all school-related functions. Students without I.D. cards will pay adult prices at high school events.** Lost I.D.'s must be replaced at a cost of \$5.00. Wear your ID everyday!

STATION 11 – PARKING INFORMATION

Seniors who would like the opportunity to park on campus must complete an application for an every day parking permit. **Juniors** must verify their enrollment in the following programs which require an every day parking pass: CO-OP, Intro to Teaching, and Internships. **Juniors not enrolled in the above programs** must complete an application to be eligible for a Range parking permit on an odd or even day basis only.

STATION 12 – SCHOOL STORE

(open during the school year)

Locks and heart rate straps will be distributed **during the school year** from the School Store. Be ready to show your fee sheet. Locks are \$6.00. P.E. locks purchased from Thompson or Wredling Middle Schools may be used at the high school. The School Store is open everyday before school and during all lunch hours.

STATION 13 – SCHEDULE PICK-UP— LRC

STATION 14—TEXTBOOKS—LRC AND BOOKROOM

Your STUDENT ID will be needed to pick up your textbooks.

STATION 15—CHROMEBOOKS—LRC

Your STUDENT ID will be needed to pick up your Chromebook. The D303 Student & Parent Device Agreement must be signed by both student and parent prior to receiving your Chromebook.


