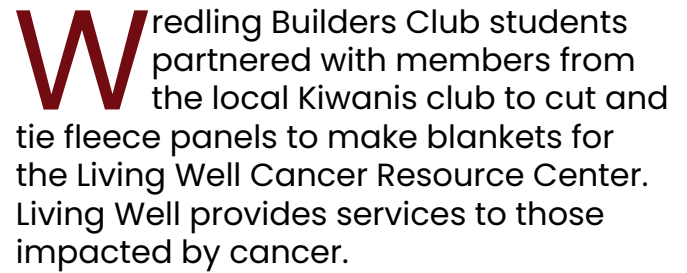

**O**n February 12, Lincoln students had the honor of welcoming two Circuit Court Judges for special read alouds in celebration of Abraham Lincoln's birthday and Illinois Judges Go to School Day.

In the morning, Judge Sandra Parga read a short story to kindergarteners and 1st graders, who then had the opportunity to ask questions about her job and career and even got to use her gavel. Parents then joined the group in the LRC and attentively listened to the kindergarteners present their final research projects on "Careers and Tools." As a special treat, several parent volunteers and District staff shared information about their jobs and careers. Students got to meet nurses, police officers, physical therapists, a musician, a manufacturing engineer, and even a mosaicist, and they showcased some of the tools they use in their jobs.



In the afternoon, Judge Jill Otte and parent volunteers joined the kindergarteners in the LRC for their final research presentations before sharing about their own jobs and careers. Then, 2nd graders joined the kindergarteners and Judge Otte in the LRC for a fun read aloud.



### Art Projects Bring Traditions to Life

**C**orrón art students created colorful dragons, lanterns, and other crafts as a creative way to learn about and celebrate the upcoming Chinese New Year. Students also learned about the traditions associated with this holiday, including special meals, cleaning rituals, and the symbolism of the zodiac animals.

"Incorporating cultural celebrations into the curriculum helps students connect with the world around them and understand the significance of different cultural practices," expressed Corron Art Teacher Rebecca Hubbs.

"Hopefully, this memorable and enriching experience will inspire them to continue learning about and appreciating different cultures in the future," she added.



## Braille Activities at Thompson

In honor of National Braille Literacy Month, Thompson Vision Teacher Tara Ozehowski hosted “Boppin’ with Braille” in January to celebrate the incredible code that provides access to reading and writing to millions of people all over the world. During tutorials, students partook in writing Braille with a Perkins Braille Writer, used common tactile adaptations (“bump dots”) to write their name, explored fun Braille Legos, used 3D printed Braille letter stamps, and even interacted with Braille technology that is continuously being advanced.

## Prevention Week at North Promotes Mental Health



During the week of February 12, St. Charles North High School's HOPE Club sponsored Prevention Week, a time dedicated to providing education to students and staff about the impacts of mental-emotional health disorders on people's lives. Topics addressed included factors that affect mental-emotional health, such as sleep habits, social media use, and bullying, and also shared information about common mental health disorders.

As the school community focuses on sharing support resources available to students within the school and the local community, they continue to promote the message that "Mental Health Matters."
