

The SAT is coming up on April 13. Our [College and Career Readiness Website](#) has links to more information about the SAT test, college entrance considerations, and resources/tools for support. Perhaps the best resource for personalized practice is Khan Academy. Students who took the PSAT in the fall can [link their College Board Account to Khan Academy](#). Once linked, Khan Academy will prescribe specific, individualized practice to each student based on areas for recommended improvement from the PSAT. In a study of nearly 250,000 test-takers, students who utilized Khan Academy for 20 hours had an average score gain of 115 (Composite, English + Math) points between the PSAT and SAT.
